The Meaning of our Actions

One of the most Zionist Psukim in the Torah is in this week's Parsha and it also happens to be one of the most misunderstood ones.

The Torah says that when The Jewish People enter the Land of Israel after being in the desert for so long and they conquer and settle the land, they need to "remember that it is Hashem who gives you the power to get wealth".

People mistaken this to mean, we should realize that everything we have and everything we do - it isn't us, rather it is Hashem. But that simply isn't what it says. At all.

It says we should realize that it is Hashem who enables US TO DO IT! This is not supposed to weaken our sense of accomplishment as if to say - man's effort is meaningless - rather, it is supposed to infuse our human actions with divine meaning, as if to say - everything we do, Hashem is involved in and enables us to do.

Put differently - how does Hashem act in this world? Through OUR actions. It is two very different ways of looking at the world and at the meaning of our human actions.

That is why it is one of the most Zionist Psukim in the Torah. Jews conquering and settling the Land of Israel, means Hashem is conquering and settling the land of Israel - through our actions.

111 p'sukim – ranks 26th (4th in D'varim)
Same number of p'sukim as Vayikra, but larger
1747 words – ranks 16th (3rd in D'varim)
Same number of words as Ki Tavo;
Ki Tavo has more p'sukim; Eikev has more letters
6865 letters – ranks 14th (3rd in D'varim)
Eikev's p'sukim are long – 3rd longest in the Torah in words and letters per pasuk. This accounts for rise in ranking in those categories.
