### Parshat Eikev with Rav Gal!

I still remember being 17 years old and passing by one of my magic teacher's home's. My teacher who was much older than me wanted to inspire me and said to me while pointing at his house 'I built this house with my 10 fingers, I worked really hard and was able to build this home for my family'.

I remember thinking to myself 'something is missing in my teacher's words'.

What was missing was a reference or an appreciation to Hashem.

In this weeks Parahsa the Torah teaches us that when a person builds a home, succeeds in business or achieves great things, it's a natural thing for him to forget about Hashem and to think that his success is a result of his own hard work.

The Torah teaches us that we need to always remember that Hashem is the one who took us out of Egypt and that he is the one who decides to bless us with success in all fields of life. Of course we can be happy with our success as it is a result of our hard work but on the other hand we have to remember that Hashem is the one who blessed us with the ability to succeed.

So, why is it important to remember that and always mention Hashem while talking about your success? (for instance, when you want to tell someone about how you did well in a project, you should say 'Baruch Hashem I really did well' or something like that...)

The answer is that it's important because when we remember where we came from and who is the one that really helps us in this world, then we remember our obligation as Jews and human beings to help others and to make the world a better place.

Arrogance and thinking only about ourselves distances us from each other while modesty and true appreciation of myself together with Hashem and Am Yisrael's history brings us closer to each other. May we always be modest and remember to think about our friends during camp activities and during our life together here as part of the moshava family.

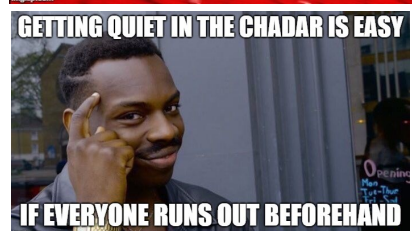

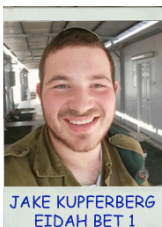
