


I'll be coming to camp with my wife – Chani who will be Rosh Chadar, and 4 of my 6 gorgeous children.

I'd like to share with you a short D'var Torah for Pesach, which is also related to our upcoming camp experience IY"H:

In our world, there is normally some tension between being spiritual and the physical world. What does lots of eating, sleeping, dancing, dressing up have to do with spirituality? However, when it comes to Pesach – Not only do we eat the Afikoman which represents the

Pesach offering (קרבן פסח) at the very end of the seder – when are satiated, when our stomach is full from the meal, the matsot and the 4 cups of wine, but we also eat the Karpas before the meal which functions

as an appetizer – to encourage us to eat even more! If we celebrate freedom (חרות) on Pesach – true spiritual freedom – wouldn't it be more appropriate to celebrate it in a more spiritual way?



I believe this is one of our goals this summer at camp. We will bring the spirit of Torah to camp and will practice the life of Torah and Avoda such that there is no conflict between these two important values of Torah and Avoda, which can complement each other through the freedom of Torah. To state it differently, one plus one can really equal much more than just two!

Rav Dudi Winkler studied at Yeshivot in Eli and Dimona and received Semicha from the Meretz Kollel. He served as a combat medic in the IDF, and then, after many years dedicated to learning, began teaching at Yeshivat Lev HaTorah. In 2011, he and his family went on shlichut to Melbourne, Australia where Rav Dudi spent three years as Rosh Kollel of the Mizrachi Bet Midrash. Upon their return to Israel last year, Rav Dudi resumed his post as rebbe at Yeshivat Lev HaTorah and took on an additional role as inaugural director of Lev LaChayal, the Yeshiva Center for Lone Soldiers of the IDF.

The kids who were born in their hospital room saluting and shouting "קו המפקד". The second are the people who just recently fell in love with Israel and realize they couldn't leave. I'm never really sure how to answer this question because on one side, I only decide to go the army a year ago. However, on the other hand, I've always wanted to join the army, I just never thought of it realistically, because for most of my life I was the kid whose feet and knees hurt him all the time. From the Mitbach - A taste of Camp At Home! Crustless Cheesecake - GF and KP

Ingredients

- 1 8-oz pkg cream cheese
- 1/3 c sugar
- ½ tsp vanilla (for Pesach, use vanilla sugar if KP vanilla is unavailable)
- 2 tbsp sour cream
- 1 egg plus 1 egg yolk
- ½ tsp lemon zest (optional)

Equipment

- Measuring cups and spoons
- Mixing bowls and spoons
- Zester
- Baking pan


Preheat oven to 350°F (180°C). Combine all ingredients, one at a time, beating until thick and creamy. Pour into lightly greased baking pan and

bake 50 minutes until puffy and slightly browned. Let cool 1-2 hours before chilling at least 4 hours. Serve cold.

Yields 1 Cake


