Leadership, By Rav Dudi

Shabbat Shalom Camp Moshava Family.

Our Parash – Parashat Pinchas has a lot to do with leadership:

Pinchas, Moshe, Aharon, Tsofchad's daughters, Yehoshua etc.

This week I'd like to focus on the requirements from a leader.

Moshe knows that he is about to die. Rashi tells us that he wanted his sons to be his successors, but Hashem did not think this was the best idea.

Moshe's sons have not been with Moshe during all the happenings of Am Yisrael. They were with Tziporah and Yitro in Midyan.

Moshe wants to make sure that the proper leader is chosen and ask Hashem for the following: **יִקְרָא יְקֹנֶק אֶלֶי הָרוּחַת לְכָל־בָּשָׂר אִישׁ עַל־הָעֵדָה**

Rashi explains that the meaning of this passuk is:

מִנֵּה עֲלֵיהֶם מְנַהִיג שִׁיחָא סוּבֵל כָּל אֶחָד וְאֶחָד לִפְי דַּעְתּוֹ

Moshe is looking for a leader that knows how to lead a nation as a whole, but at the same time can relate to every single individual as an individual.

In Chinuch –the key for success is to look at each student and his special needs.

A good leader is not the one who can only lead the herd, rather knows how to listen and take care of every single person.

Moshe was able to give us the Torah only because he was able to make every Jew feel that Moshe speaks to him and to him only. Every Jew felt as if the Torah was a personal call from Hashem.

Yehoshua was with Moshe throughout the entire history of Am Yisrael and the main thing he learned from his master was not just the knowledge, rather the ability to develop a personal relationship with everyone.

Here at Moshava we are a warm lovely family and as such – our aim is to connect with every camper on a personal level.
