The Aseret HaDibrot (the original top 10 list) are re-stated in our parsha. There is something that makes Dibra 1 and 10 unique from the other 8.

Dibra 1 is "Anochi Hashem..." a commandment that doesn't have a specific command. It simply says "I am God who took you out of Egypt" The understanding here is that what we are "commanded" to do here is believe and understand at all times that Hashem is indeed is Hashem and is the one and only that took us out of Egypt.

Dibra 10 is "Lo Tachmod..." a commandment to not be jealous of what is not ours.


What makes these two different from the others like "Keep Shabbat" or "don't kill/kidnap/murder" is that all the other 8 are about actions that can be witnessed by others and a potential court case for its violation can be brought against the person who did it. "Anochi Hashem" and "Lo Tachmod" are commandments of the mind—of our thoughts. If one were to not believe in Hashem or be jealous at any moment, nobody would know.

The fact that these two mitzvot our the "Bookends" of sorts of the Aseret HaDibrot teaches us that our thoughts matter. All actions, both good and

evil begin with our thoughts. If we know that we have to keep our thoughts holy then we can hope to only have our actions be the same.

As we welcome our new campers and continue this amazing summer together may we have holy thoughts and holy actions around us.
